We have been so well connected at MBM and we have experienced the love of God through the people at MBM. We haven't made acquaintances here, we've made friends!
























Rooty Hill


I give thanks for the welcoming heart of God that is on display week after week from our people. Time and time again, the feedback from visitors has been: "I felt so welcomed".
